The Book of Judges

Problem at the outset. The land is not conquered. Compare Josh 10:40; 11:16; 11:23.

A. Major Judges

1. Othniel << Judah (3:7-11) (Ideal portrayal of judges and leadership)

- 1. Israel's disobedience (v. 7)
- 2. YHWH's punishment (v. 8)
- 3. Israel's cry/repentance (v. 9)
- 4. YHWH's deliverance by judges (v.10)
- The case is settled temporarily; but the problem returns (v. 11)

2. Ehud << Benjamin (3:12-30)

fought against Moab problem?

3. Deborah << Ephraim (chaps 4-5

fought against King Jabin of Canaan in Hazor problem?

4. Gideon << Manasseh (chaps 6-9)

fought ag. the Midianites problem? Gideon=Jerubbal (6:32) Read Jud 7:5b-6a in various Korean translations

Judges 8:1-3 The Ephraimites against Gideon Abimeleck and Jotham's parable (chap 9) Concerning kingship Jud 8:22

5. Jepthah-- the Gileadite (chaps 10-12)

Fought ag. the Ammonites and delivered the Gileadites. problem? -son of a prostitute (11:1) -rash vow (11:30-31): child sacrifice -Ephraimites contended Jephthah (12:1)--civil war בלקת שָׁבֹלֶת

6. Samson << Dan (13-16) Fought ag. the Philistines problem? a type of person with lots of mussle but no brain tearing a lion apart (14:6), torches on 300 foxes into the field (15:4-5) married a Philistine woman from Timnah (14:1-3). affair with a prostitute (16:1) fell in love with Delilah (16:4ff) Nazarene: no wine, no unclean food, no razor on the head (13:4-5) suicide (16:23-31)

B. <u>Migration of the Danites</u> (chaps 17-18) In those days there was no king in Israel; all the people did what was right in their own eyes (17:6; 18:1; 19:1; 21:25)

C. Breaking of Civil War (chaps 19-21)

Levite's stay at Gibeah (King Saul's home town, 1 Sam 10:26): 19:14

Silence from women -Guest's two virgin daughters and his concubine and the Levite's concubine (19:24-25), daughters of Shiloh (21:21).

Conclusion. The combined expression of the need for kingship (17:6; 18:1; 19:1; 21:25) and the inadequate ruling of the tribal leaders points to the anticipation of a Judean ruler. The Benjaminites (and Saul) are compared and contrasted with the Judahites (and David).
